THE VALLEY HUMBLES YOU, BUT ALSO BECOMES THE GROUND WHERE GOD RESTORES LIFE.

The valley is a low place. It's the shadowed ground between the mountains, the place where battles are fought and tears are shed. In Scripture, valleys are often places of trial – but also of God's deepest work.

David wrote of walking through the "valley of the shadow of death" but not fearing evil, because God's presence was with him (*Psalm 23:4*). The valley of dry bones became the place where God breathed life back into what was dead (*Ezekiel 37:1-14*). Valleys are where God proves that His power is not limited to mountaintops.

For **The Wild Promise**, the valley represents the places of breaking – grief, addiction, loss, despair. These are the places that seem like endings. But in God's story, the valley is not the end. It's the soil of redemption. It's where life springs up again. The Vallet reminds us that our lowest points can become the most fertile ground for God's grace.
